Coming up in July ~ DOT Transportation Grants

Motorized Grants:

Community Access Grants - Communities of less than 5,000 in population and are for the construction or reconstruction of major streets in each town such as Main Street, the road to the elevator, schools, hospitals, etc.

Industrial Park Grants - Any local government for the development of new or expanded access for new industry located within industrial parks. Private sector investment of at least five times state grant. Minimum of five new jobs to be created.

Agri-Business Grants - Any local government for the development of new or expanded agri-business industries.

Funding Limits - 80% of the construction costs of the project, not including engineering or utility work. Grant size is limited to \$600,000 for Community Access and Agri-Business Grants and \$500,000 for Industrial Park Grants.

Application Documents - Project application, Project location map, Engineer's estimate, and Resolution supporting submission of application.

Project Requirements - Designed to SDDOT standards, Comply with ADA, and Designed by engineer.

Non-Motorized Grants:

Transportation Alternative Grants - Any local government for the construction of paths for pedestrian and bicycle travel.

Safe Routes to School - Any local government aiming to make it safer for students to walk and bike to school and encourage more walking and biking where safety is not a barrier.

Rails to Trails - Any local government interested in the conversion of abandoned railway corridors to Trails or preservation of historically significant railroad related items.
